November Board Meeting Minutes

The RVMRC Board met on November 10, 2004. Three board officers and 5 members were present. (It should be noted that items of interest voted on by the board always includes votes by both the board officers and members present. Leftover paint from the Clubhouse painting project was sold to the Live Steamers, who will use it for several of the small buildings around their operation. Live Steamers gave us a donation

towards the maintenance of the Clubhouse. Rain gutters need to be cleaned. We are still having problems with birds pecking holes in the attic vent screens. Jim has inventoried many of the books recently donated by Tom Smith. Bruce is assisting in the task. They hope to have the complete list ready for publishing in the January Passing Track. The Club has also received more books from the estate of Marvin Curtis. We need more bookshelf space. Richard Clark of Grants Pass was accepted as a new associate member. In exchange for their donation to the show raffle, Walthers Inc. has again requested a copy of the club's mailing list. If anyone

Meet Andy Anderson

If anyone needs an example of why anyone with a heart for model railroading can find a reason to be in our Club, one needs to look no further than Andy Anderson. A long time railroad enthusiast, Andy has had a recent number of medical setbacks, which would have ended participation in the Club for most people. But, Andy has been determined to contribute any which way he can. Not more than a year or so after joining, Andy lost the sight of his left eye. He was simply hosing of his driveway when a vein burst. Forty-five minutes later, Andy had vision remaining in only one eye. More recently, Andy has had a bout with back problems. After x-rays, the doctors discovered 3 discs that were bulging and causing Andy a great deal of pain. The gang at Medford's "Back-to-Back" pain control has gotten Andy to where he can now stand up straight, though Andy is limited to lifting less than 20 pounds. In the last few months, Andy has been through a number of medical tests to find out why he has lost some of his "steam" (he thought perhaps there was a stuck popoff valve in his boiler!). Thankfully, doctors have not found any other serious health issues. And what does Andy regret about his medical malaise...not being able to participate in Club activities as much as he wanted to. During his "inactivity", Andy has often brought the Saturday work crew donuts or hamburger lunches; has helped during the public run sessions; has done some of the light duty maintenance like track cleaning; and has generally shared his gift of gab with both club members and publics alike. On behalf of the Park Clubs, Andy wrote a terrific letter to the editor of the Medford Tribune (see below). He followed that effort with another terrific letter just this week (see exerpts below).



Andy has recently written the Club a letter. He says: "Thanks so much to all of you who signed the VERY NICE get well card I received a few days ago. As most of you know, I've missed a lot of the club's meetings of which I feel badly about. I've always wanted to do the best I could to be a productive member of our club over the last 4 years...The best I can help out this year [at the RR show] is to sell tickets and be an announcer. Thanks to Brad's help last year, I hope I can be a better announcer than I was last year...To any of you who have 30 minutes, or so, come over to my home to help in the design of my garage layout, if possible." Hopefully, we can give Andy the boost he needs to build his layout!

Andy grew up in New England, had an uncle who was trainmaster for the NYC, joined the Air Force in 1953, became a jet engine mechanic and pilot, and promptly resigned his Air Force commission to find better paying work to support his wife and 5 children. After 45 years in the car sales and management business, Andy finally found the space to build a layout. He has an enclosed, carpeted, heated/air conditioned garage, a lot of pre-made benchwork, and a plan, but would really like some advice from the Club on his layout design. His interest lies in steam and early diesel, with most of the rolling stock being Northern and Southern Pacific. Andy will be taking his east coast rolling stock to the Railroad Show.


