Railroad Park Opens for 2008


On a balmy Sunday on April 13, the Medford Railroad Park opened its doors for the 2008 season. The parking lots were filled to capacity by 11:30 and remained that way until around 2:00 pm. The park clubs have been busy with additions and renovations, including the addition of the motorcar rides by the Historical Society. The RVMRC showed off its new transition layout, with the temporary yard modules attached to the helix to what will be the Klamath Falls yards. Given the near-perfect weather, the addition of a food facility, and the addition of the hand-car rides, there was a steady, albeit light, stream of visitors to the layout. Many a visitor was heard to say: "things have changed". Indeed, things have changed.

From a bright blue sky on the north and east walls, to the detailed scenery at Medco and in the Cascades at the summit, at Butte Falls and at Derby, to the new helix, and the near dominant DCC operation, the RVMRC showed off a winter of work. Members who participated in the Sunday session had some interesting observations. Several members commented that there were times when trains were either not running or not visible to our guests, and people just left. A number of guests expressed interest in wanting to see the closed area of White City and Eagle Point. Several times, RVMRC members escorted folks into the closed area and the people were appreciative. One club member suggested that we make such "tours" more available and take advantage of educating our visitors one-on-one about the basics of model railroading and layout construction. Another suggested

we place Plexiglas along the edge and allow the publics [but control numbers to comply with fire codes and aisle widths] in our "closed" area, but wait to do so until a little more scenery is completed. It was noted that the fire department would not allow unfettered access past Derby and Medford Yard due to the narrow walkway at that point. Thus, only controlled, limited, and escorted access is allowed. Several members commented that more interaction with our visitors would be nice.

Because there is a change to predominantly DCC, Club President Dave Carr would like to remind everyone that preparation to run one's DCC equipment should be done prior to operations on Sunday. Jay Mudge and others who have expertise would like to enjoy the Sunday run sessions operating *their* equipment, and not spend the day programming, trouble shooting, and coaching on DCC. The Club periodically offers DCC learning and programming sessions, and experts are generally available on Saturday work sessions to help with technical issues. Though there were a few momentary glitches, train operations were very smooth.

Be sure to sign up for engineer slots, as well as parking duties, to give those in charge of scheduling the information they need to secure the people needed for each Sunday. The signup sheets are on the bulletin board.

April Board Meeting Notes

The Club Board met on April 9, 2008. Two Club officers (President Carr, and Secretary Dougall) were present as well as member-at-large Dick Stark. In addition, four members were present giving the Club a quorum in which to conduct business. In the Treasurer's absence, Jim Dougall read the financial report. The club's finances are in good standing. The purchase of a new heating and air conditioning system accounted for the Club's largest recent purchase, though significant expenses have been incurred with the recent explosion of work on the permanent layout.

Dick Stark reported on the Railroad Park Committee meeting. The group discussed the parking issues noting that each of the Clubs need to be vigilant about supporting and participating in the parking lot attendant duties. This is important since the Park is becoming very popular and generally fills the available parking. Dick reminded us that we cannot have a single incident while using the fire department parking lot, or that privilege will be lost. Dick was given several suggestions to take back to the Committee including having clubs rent scouts, service clubs, or security services should they not be able to provide personnel to the parking duties.

Jay reported on the Electrical Committee. He and Ed Kleinman reported numerous electrical issues when they tried to connect the DCC to the modular portion of the layout, and later discovered the source of the problem as competing power sources. Jay also reported that the permanent layout will use the SRC-80 exclusively.

E. Don reported problems with most of the trucks on LBF cars. The multi-part construction of the trucks interfere with proper operation. He has replaced many of the trucks on cars being used on the layout. Otherwise, 95% of the cars scheduled for use on the layout are passing muster.

Several groups will visit[ed] the park during April: a retired senior group (April 18); Central Point third graders (April 25). Important dates for which the Club needs to be open include June 5-7 for the SP Historical Society meeting in Medford and June 20 for the KADEE QUALITY Products annual company party. Members are encouraged to help staff the layout during those events.

The Club is planning an operations session sometime in late July. This will serve as the first of several trial sessions prior to the Labor Day operations session with the Lane Society of Model Engineers. A roster of P&E locomotives and paint schemes are being developed.

A DCC session will be held soon for those needing to install/learn about DCC.

Espee In Oregon

The Medford Railroad Park includes the Rogue Valley Model Railroad Park layout; Southern Oregon Chapter National Railway Historical Society which has restored Espee equipment and other items; Southern Oregon Live Steamers who will be hosting train rides; Southwest Oregon Large Scale trains which will be running their garden layout; and the Morse Telegraph Club showing us the good ol' days. More clinics after lunch at the church, dinner on your own, then evening slide show.
