NMRA Joint Convention in Medford May 2012

A joint effort between Pacific Northwest Region and Pacific Coast Region to hold a joint convention in 2012 to be held in Medford, Oregon on May 2 through 6, 2012. The Convention venue is the Medford Red Lion Hotel. All "inside" activities (Clinics, meetings, contest, etc.) are planned to be conducted in the hotel. Several significant outside activities are in the planning stages. These include, but are not limited to: a smorgasbord of model railroading activities you've come to expect, including clinics, contests, prototype tours, layout tours, operating sessions, breakfasts, banquet, and more!

<u>Early indications are that the Railroad Park will be the site of one of the Convention's field trips, and the Club is entertaining hosting an operations session for Convention guests.</u>




Cartography Project: Test Your Knowledge by Ron Harten


To recap, next year's regional NMRA meeting is in Medford, and the P&E will likely host several operating sessions during the meeting. It was noted that the P&E did not have a detailed track plan, so I decided to draw one up. Using a program called 'Empire Express', I have completed the track plan. Along the way I have come to know the P&E track plan quite well. Now is the opportunity for you to test your knowledge.

How well do you know the P&E layout? Here are a series of questions to check your knowledge and get you better acquainted with the layout.


Question 1) Where are these track configurations on the layout?







Question 2) Where does the left track in this picture go?



- a) Butte Falls,
- b) the mystery track from which trains do not return (eBay?)
- c) hidden storage

Question 3) How many turnouts (switches) are on the layout?

Question 4) How much track is on the layout?

Question 5) How long is the main line?

Question 6) What is the car capacity of Crater Yard?

Question 7) How many different continuous loops exist on the layout?

Bonus Question 8) How long does a train take to circumvent the entire mainline traveling at 30 scale miles per hour. Hint: You'll need the scale of HO to figure out how many real feet 1 foot of HO track represents.

Tidying Up Around the Layout

While construction work on the layout takes a summer vacation along with the rest of us, there is still some progress being made.



(Top) Location labels help the public (and new club members) understand the geographic locations on the layout.

(Below) the trim work on the fascia below Butte Falls gives the layout a "finished" look



Answers to Layout Test

- Q1) (Top Diagram) MEDCO; (Middle Diagram) Crater Yard; (Bottom) Eagle Point
- Q2) C
- Q3) 185 turnouts
- Q4) 1730 feet
- Q5) 531 feet (8.8 scale miles)
- Q6) 50 (50ft) cars
- Q7) 4

Main (KF- Medford) Upper Level Klamath Falls Peninsula Lower Level

Bonus Question: At 1:87 scale, each foot of track is 87 real feet. Thus, 531 feet of Club mainline equals 46,197 real feet or 8.8 miles. At 30 miles per hour, it takes 17.6 minutes to go the 8.8 real miles. (8.8 miles/30 mph=.29 hours or 17.6 minutes)--and you thought your high school algebra was useless!
