


## **Operating Session with Eugene Club**


#### **Crossing Flashers in White City**

The redesign of parts of White City has created the need for several sets of signaled crossings to support switching operations. These crossings do not require gates, signal flashing units are sufficient. Since these signals will cover industrial tracks, conventional crossing signal control boards with four optical sensors will not work properly. What is needed is a circuit which the operator uses to turn on on the signals when the switchiing operation begins. The club members did not want to have to turn off the flashers manually. Some form of timer was needed to keep the signals going for a fixed period of time. The circuit below contains 3 elements: An oscillator which provides the  $\frac{1}{2}$  second flash rate, signal driver section which provides the current to drive the LEDs in the signals, and a timer circuit which turns on the circuit for 40 seconds and then shuts it off. The signals are activated by a push button on the facia. Please note this circuit does not use the common anode or common cathode wiring setup for the signals. This is not an issue if you assemble your own or use the kits from Oregon Rail. A slightly more complicated circuit which can drive common cathode or common anode circuits will be shown in the next issue. The 'chips' are LM555 IC's. The circuit elements are based on circuits found on the internet www.discovercircuits.com , home.cogeco.ca and "IC Timer Cookbook, by W. Jung, SAMS.
