- Modeler of the Year -



This year's Modeler of the year has made many contributions to the Rogue Valley Model Railroad Club since becoming a member a few years ago He suggested and did most of the work on a card based system to describe and track the club's rolling stock and motive power. - Color Codes for Switch Stands -

There are many manually thrown switches on the P&E. The handle used to change the switch position is painted one color on one side and another on the 'flip' side. In most cases Green showing indicates the switch is set for the 'Main', while red indicates the switch is set for the diverging route. In some cases Yellow is used to indicate the 'through' route when it is not the Main. There are some exceptions and omissions, so it has been suggested that a consistent set of color rules be adopted. The following is the proposed set of colors. The board will make the final decsion.

The color indicates the route the switch/turnout is set for

<u>Color</u>	Route
Green	Main
Yellow	Siding
Red	Stub
White	A crossover is set for the crossover position

- Reporting Broken or Faulty Equipment -

Recently, a couple of Digitrax Throttles have been turned in with blue tape on them stating "Broken?" or "Bad". While it is appreciated that someone took the effort to put the tape on the throttle and wrote that it was faulty, it is not very helpful. We need to know what is broken or what type of behavior the throttle exhibited. For example: "throttle would not allow me to consist locomotives. All other single engine functions seem to work."; "Throttle will not turn on properly. Screen stays blank and green leds flash. No control of locomotive is possible." This type of information is needed by the club member who corrects a problem (reset, broken wire, etc.) or contacts Digitrax to discuss whether the item needs to be returned or not. In most cases it has been possible for us to return the item to service without sending it back to the factory. [Sending it back costs the club about \$40.] The club has a "Bad Order Form" which is used to identify and describe problems with the layout and its equipment. They are red forms which are located on the bulletin board. Please use the forms and attach them to the item. If it is a faulty switch or trackwork, place the form next to the area that needs attention. Also telll EDon or one of the board members. The information on the form is summarized below:
