


documentary of Rusty's layout on the club website, soon. For now Larry Tuttle, Judy Mallchock and several others have been cataloguing rolling stock and scenery. The layout will be dismantled by the middle of February with as many detailed scenes salvaged as possible. Some of these will be displayed in the Club's display case for the remainder of the year, a tribute to Rusty and his remarkable eye for detail. Where they fit the permanent layout, Rusty's detailed scenes and structures will continue to entertain. Larry will appreciate anyone who can volunteer to help dismantle the layout, which is about 14x26, give or take a few feet.

Operations Session with Track Warrants

January's operations session was a first ever to use track warrants. After a brief introduction on the warrant system, the ops session began. Yard limit signs ("Y") were posted along the P&E. If a Y was facing you on your right you were entering the yard. If it was facing you left, you were leaving the yard. If you ventured out on the mainline past the yard limit, you were required to obtain a track warrant, which specified when, how long, and to what point you would be allowed on the main. These were communicated via radio to each conductor/engineer who requested use of the mainline. In a few locations, like White City, there is little need for a warrant. The haulers, however, were in constant need of a warrant, and the respective conductors were quite busy with the necessary communications and paperwork. Dispatcher Tuttle's philosophy is simple...let us learn about TWC and use it for a few months to see how we like it. Then, if somebody wants to work up Direct Traffic Control and implement it, we can run with DTC for a while. By the end of the year, we should have had ample opportunity to work with and evaluate both systems and make a decision on which one we prefer for the P&E. If no one comes up with a DTC system this year, no problem -- we can always consider it at a later date. Better to do a well thought out system later than a hap-hazard one now. (Dispatching should not be hap-hazard!)

P.S. Some of our scenes are getting close to ready for prime time, no?

January Board Meeting Notes

The Rogue Valley Model Railroad Club board of directors met on Wednesday, January 13, 2010. There were four board and twelve club members present. The Club continues to be in good standing financially, buoyed by a financially very good November railroad show. Jerry presented a proposed budget for 2010 in which income exceeds anticipated expenses for the year, unlike 2009 when many expenses went into the permanent layout.

Dave Spakousky reports that he and Ed Kleinman are finishing up the signal wiring for the Medco and Cascade Crest area. Both of them need a little healing, however, before they can finish their work (knee and back, respectively). Gas (and therefore heat) was shut off for a day or so as the Fire Department put in a new gas line for a training facility which led to a new line into the building for the club.

The Club received kudos and a big thanks from Klamath Rails Club for our participation in their annual railroad show in October. An invite was sent to the club to participate again this year. While likely planning to do so, the Club did not formally discuss the event so far out in the year. The board voted to continue supporting the November railroad show using the Club's insurance policy for the event. The club is reimbursed for that use.

Larry Tuttle will NOT present the January program on building a scene, but instead provide a session on operations using Track Warrants.

Dave Spakousky shared a drawing of the proposed Thomas the Tank kids layout he and several club members proposed for our Sunday run sessions. The layout features two independent loops with a number of industry sidings and a few other structures. The idea is to give the younger kids a hands-on experience at the park while the adults be more in tune with the club's layout. It is a 4x6 layout that will fit over a folding table to keep it from moving.

Dave and E. Don are looking for clips, other than paper clips, or some kind of sleeve system for the waybill cards. It was noted that the paper clips tend to be grabby and cause some of the car cards to come apart.
